Fellow Trusted Servants,

Item 1 - WordPress backups are up-to-date, with multiple redundancy.

Item 2 - All WordPress plug-ins are up-to-date, and we are running the most current version of WordPress (6.7).

Item 3 - Failed log-in attempts to our WordPress web authoring site Nov 11 – Nov 17 totaled 5. There was 1 "lock-out" (repeated failed log-in attempts from the same IP address in one sitting) since the last report. No clear trend was identified.

Item 4 - The Meeting List for Jefferson County and Environs has required no updates since October 9 (addition of the Newcomer Meeting at Dexter's Living Sober Group). The current meeting list is posted as a PDF on the JCI website (and on the "Blue Chair" Meeting Guide app) and our desktop in the office, as indicated in Todd Dallesandro's previous mid-month email.

**Item 5 - Widely reported Wordpress Security Flaw Identified**

"A critical vulnerability was discovered in a popular WordPress security plugin with over 4 million installations. The flaw allows attackers to log in as any user, including administrators, and gain full access to their site-level permissions." Reports Search Engine Journal.

The flaw existed in a Wordpress security plugin Really Simple Security, a WordPress plugin that was developed to improve resistance of WordPress sites against hackers.

Not to worry – aacli.org uses a different plugin – Limit Login Attempts.

Just an example of the potential for security flaws to be inadvertently introduced through plugin updates, even from reputable software vendors. This is the reason that a backup strategy is important – to protect against damage to the website.
